Dear Prof. Heringer

I have with Prof. Planch  
most carefully compared your  
specimens of C. glauca & torulosa  
with one another & with the  
whole suite of specimens in the  
Herb. Acad., & I can not  
doubt that they are the same  
species. - We know that C. torulosa  
was first planted in the  
Peninsula of India, & there is  
nothing improbable in the supposition  
that it was imported to us from  
the Hindoos. - That it is not  
indigenous in the Decan Peninsula



is much certain. It is a tender plant,  
we cannot keep it at Kew. - Of  
many specimens planted only one  
has survived.

Yours are much welcome & make  
my use of this information.
